What to bring to Hospital

- Medications: bring all your regular medications in their original boxes
- Documents: doctor's letter, pathology reports, x-rays
- · Health insurance and concession cards
- Bank card to pay out of pocket expenses
- · Sleepwear and robe
- · Non-slip slippers
- An overnight bag with change of clothing to cover duration of your stay
- Toiletries e.g. comb, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo and conditioner
- Eyeglasses, hearing aid, dentures (if applicable and all with their cases)
- · Aids e.g. frame, walking stick, CPAP machine.

We have limited space for storage of luggage and ask on the day of admission that you bring a small overnight bag only. Family members or carers can bring in additional belongings to the ward after surgery.

If you are a Day Case we suggest you wear comfortable, loose fitting clothing and remove all jewellery prior to arrival.

Valuables

We strongly advise that non-essential items (such as laptops, excessive money, jewellery, cameras or items of sentimental value) be left at home. Whilst the hospital maintains security, we cannot be held liable or responsible for lost or stolen items.

Bring evidence of COVID-19 testing

Before coming to hospital, complete a RAT on the day of your admission. Please bring evidence of the negative RAT result *e.g.* by taking a photo on the day of admission.

Special needs

We encourage patients with specific needs to reach out to us to discuss how we can help prepare for your admission. Call 1300 052 602 and ask to speak to our Pre-Admission nursing staff.



Car Parking
